Muskoka Agriculture is Something Special

- Retreating Glaciers left pockets of good soil
- High organic matter 4-5%
- Over 200 farms number steady for past 20 years
- Small farm size- 40 ha average
- Open farmland totals 7000ha- only 0.25% of Muskoka's land area
- No big industrial farms
- · Less fertilizers and pesticides used
- Environment protected/ enhanced

Muskoka Agriculture – its more than you Think!

- Muskoka farm revenue increasing.
- \$6 million in 2006
- Economic impact approximately \$18 million
- Non economic benefits
 - Recreation
 - Tourism
 - Open space provides "balance"
 - Biodiversity

Muskoka Agriculture- Small Scale and Diverse

- No large cash-cropping, or intensive animal operations
- Instead:
 - Grass fed cow- calf
 - Special pork breeds
 - Free range poultry
 - Lambs
 - Mushrooms
 - Green houses
 - Vegetables and berries
 - Cranberries
 - Honey
 - Maple syrup

But there are Threats...

- Muskoka farmers are old
 - average age 57. Ontario average 52
 - How can farmland be protected?
- No soils map
 - where are the good soils?
- Young people want to farm
 - How can they be encouraged?
